## About the college :

Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Bongaigaon, a premier institute of higher education for women in west Assam, was established in the year 1993. The initial objectives of establishing this institution was to disseminate knowledge & skill to the women of nearby areas of Bongaigaon district. Located at the heart of the Bongaigaon town, the college is very well connected both by road and rail communication. An institution of higher education solely for women was a long felt need of the region. This need brought together a likeminded group of Philanthropists led by Mr. Phani Bhushan Choudhury, MLA of Bongaigaon and sprouted a dream by the name of Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya. Thus, the college first started its journey in 1993 with just 50 students and 7 faculty members. But today the college has grown into an institute of excellence with more than 1300 students and 35 faculty members. Though initially the college started only with the Higher Secondary classes, subsequently, later in 1995 it started the undergraduate courses in arts as Bachelor of Arts (BA).

The college was accorded affiliation by Gauhati University and recognized by the UGC under sections 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC act. The College has undergone the assessment and accreditation system by NAAC in the year 2022-23 and have achieved B++ grade (2.82 CGPA) in its Cycle-I.

With the implementation of NEP-2020 the college is offering Four Years Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) in Arts Stream for Major & Minor. The college also offer Higher Secondary Course under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). Apart from these the college have study centre of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) which offers various Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate courses through distance mode. In addition the college also offers different add on certificate courses run by different departments.

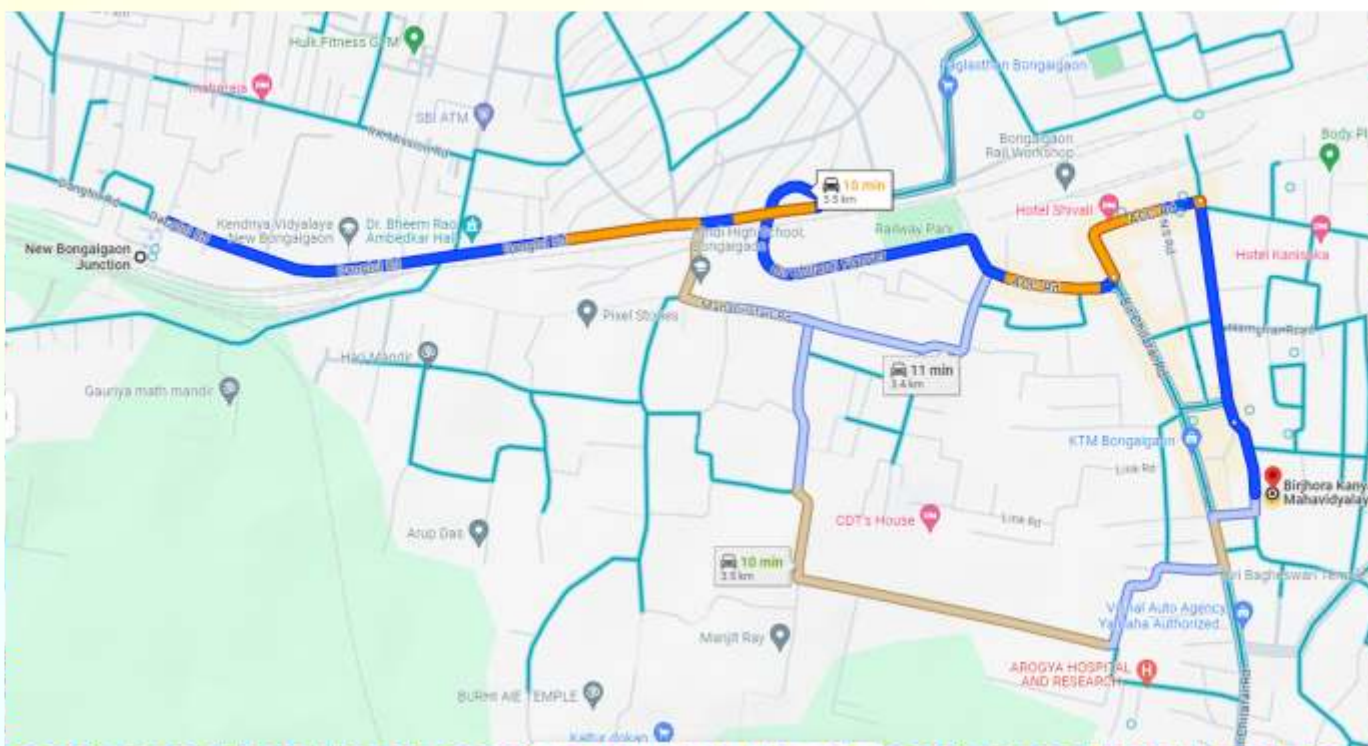

## Code of Conduct :

Code of Conduct is a collection of rules and regulations that need to be followed by each and every students. The college have a handbook of code of conduct for students which states clearly what is and is not acceptable behaviour of the students.

1. The student should reach at College premises before 10-30 a.m. positively as the College gate will remain closed after 10.30 A.M.
2. Wearing uniform is compulsory for students except on Thursday.
3. Students are strictly prohibited from leaving the college campus during the college hour without prior permission of the authority.
4. Every students should posses Identity Card with her photo affix on it duly attested by the Principal.
5. A Student of H.S. Classes must attend at least 75% of the total classes held during the session and for a degree student 95% attendance is compulsory.
6. Any form of ragging is strictly prohibited. Such activities will be dealt with strictly.
7. Use of Cell phones inside the classroom is strictly prohibited.
8. Students should refrain from any act of discrimination (Physical or Verbal) based on an individuals caste, race, religion or religious belief, colour, region, language, disability etc.
9. In case of any breakages of College property by students will be regarded an offence and student will be Rave to bear the cost of the particular item.
10. Students are strictly forbidden from participating in Political agitations of any kind.
11. Students are forbidden from organizing any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without prior permission of the principal.
12. Students are forbidden from posting any post in social media that may create problems for the institution.

If any student is found breaching of the aforesaid Codes of Conduct, a disciplinary committee will be there to look after the matter. The committee will inquire into the alleged violation and accordingly recommend suitable disciplinary action against the said student. The committee may suggest one or more disciplinary action against the student depending on the nature of misconduct. The Principal is the authority to frame and issue any disciplinary rules whenever necessary.

In order to maintain propriety, students of the college are to wear uniform, during college hours. No student is allowed to enter the College campus without prescribed uniform during college hour & examination period. Students must wear either Mekhela Sador or Salwar Kameez in the colour specified below :

Sador : Muga colour with Sea Green borders and Blou se in plain Sea Green Colour.
- b) Salwar Kameez : Salwar & Dupattain Sea Green colour and Kameez in Muga Colour.
- c) Sweater/Blazers (For Winter) : In Black Colour (Compulsory).

Though total marks 100 are allotted for each of the subjects, but the obtained mark is not calculated in the overall result. Instead of it, grade will awarded on the basis of the marks obtained by the students. Evaluation of the subjects shall be done in the institutions thereof.

**Total No. Seats in B.A. Programme (intake Capacity): 350**

### Reservation of Seat :

As per reservation policy of Govt. of Assam the institution provides reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST (P), ST(H), OBC, MOBC and Divyanjan categories and sports Quota. The candidates of reserved categories will have to produce valid certificate issued by the competent authority.

### The College adopts Admission Procedure as follows:

1. Admission Process will be through online mode using Darpan Portal for H.S. and Assam Samarth Portal for UG students.
2. Admission in H.S. and B.A. Classes is made purely on Merit Basis.
3. There are two sections both for H.S. & UG bearing 150 students capacity in each.
4. Admission Form and Prospectus can be obtained from College Website.
5. The date of submission of Forms, date of admission etc. are notified in the College Website.
6. Merit list of the selected students will be uploaded in the College Website.
7. Students must produce the following documents at the time of admission.
  - a) Original Marksheets.
  - b) Original pass Certificate from the head of the Institution last attended.
  - c) Original Caste Certificate (if applicable)
8. Hard copy of the admission form and other testimonials are to be submitted to the office of the college.





## Internal and External Assessment (FYUGP) :

### A. Evaluation of theory component

1. For setting of question papers and evaluation each credit will be considered as equivalent of 25 marks. Thus a 4-credit paper will be of 100marks and a 3-credit paper will be of 75marks.
2. Performance of students shall be monitored throughout the Semester by adopting Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation. It will have the following components, both in theory and practical
  - a. Internal, continuous evaluation (Formative Assessment): 40% of total marks in a paper.
    - a.1 50% of the total marks in this category will be allocated for sessional/midterm test to be conducted. (Example: If internal assessment marks of a subject is 40 then marks allotted for sessional examination will be 20)
    - a.2 50% will be allocated for internal assessment comprising any three of the following:
      - i. Class assignment/home assignment/case studies
      - ii. Class test/Unit test
      - iii. Field work
      - iv. Group discussion
      - v. Seminar presentation
      - vi. Participation in class discussion
      - vii. Quiz
      - viii. Any other evaluative method as determined by the concerned department

### b. End Semester Examination: 60% of total marks in a paper

(Example: In a theory paper of 100marks, 40 marks will be allocated for internal assessment of which 50%, i.e., 20marks will be allocated for sessional examination (to be conducted centrally by the institution as per university norms) and rest 50%, i.e., 20marks will be based on attendance and any three of the activities namely class assignment/home assignment/case studies, Class test, Field work, Group discussion, Seminar presentation, Participation in class discussion. The class teacher will assign the marks in this category of internal evaluation.)

### B. Evaluation for practical papers will be as follows

#### a. Internal evaluation =20% comprising of:

- a.1 Maximum of 4 marks based on lab class attendance with the following breakup
  - i. 76-80% =1
  - ii. 81-85% =2
  - iii. 86-90 =3
  - iv. 91% =4
- a.2 Maximum of 2 marks for lab records, regular completion of lab assignment
- a.3 Rest of the internal assessment marks, if any, will be awarded by the class teacher based on class performance, viva voce etc. as decided by the class teacher  
(Example: In a practical component of 50marks, internal marks will be 10 (20% of 50). A student in the highest bracket of attendance as in 5.5.5a.1(iv) will be awarded 4 and based on lab record, regularity maximum 2 will be awarded by the class teacher. Remaining 4marks out of 10 will be given by the class teacher in terms of performance of the student in lab work, viva voce etc.)
- a.4 Maximum of 4 marks will be allocated based on tutorial class attendance with the following breakup as part of internal evaluation.
  - i. 76-80% =1
  - ii. 81-85% =2
  - iii. 86-90 =3
  - iv. 91% =4

## A. Evaluation of theory component

1. For setting of question papers and evaluation each credit will be considered as equivalent of 25 marks. Thus a 4-credit paper will be of 100marks and a 3-credit paper will be of 75marks.

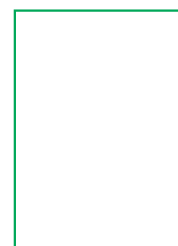

In conformity with Supreme Court judgment and direction, UGC guidelines and State Govt. Instructions, Birjhora Kanya Mahavidyalaya is following a 'Zero tolerance policy' for ragging and takes care to provide a ragging free campus.

**GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL** : As suggested by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the College has established a Grievance Redressal Cell, to provide a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances and ensure the transparency in admission, and prevention of unfair practices, etc. The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit.
